SAFETY POLICY

It is the policy of Automatic Fire to ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare of all its staff members, company trainees, visitors and contractors and further to ensure that any persons who may be effected by its work activities, are not exposed to risks to their safety and health because of the work being carried out by Automatic Fire.

We will provide the necessary resources, structures and procedures that are required to safeguard individuals against risks arising from activities in the workplace. It is a policy of Automatic Sprinklers to actively review safety and continuously improve safety procedures where possible.

Just as employers have legal responsibilities and duties of care towards the safety and health of all concerned with the operations at Automatic Fire, under the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act, 2005, and the Safety Health and Welfare at Work (Construction) Regulations 2013 employees also have legal responsibilities for their own safety and that of their fellow staff member. It is the duty of all employees to conform to Company safety policy practises and to carry out their responsibilities as detailed in this document and in accordance with any relevant legislation, and when applicable in accordance with the Main Contractors Construction Safety Statement and Site Safety Plan.

All employees who authorise work must ensure the safety, health and welfare of all persons involves, whether directly or indirectly. Members with specific responsibilities for safety, health and welfare shall delegate these responsibilities in their absence.

The Board of Directors fully endorses this policy and will support all who implement it.
